Time stops for Woodend clock works

Macedon Ranged Shire Council will be undertaking works to the Woodend Memorial Clock Tower later this month.

The works will include installation of new safety access ladders and upgrades to the electrical cabling. While the works are being completed, the clocks will be stopped for approximately one week.

Designed by architect Harold Trigg and built by Chadwick Peeler, the clock tower was constructed in 1927 as a memorial to the local men and women who served in World War I, and is used in Anzac and Remembrance days' ceremonies.

Bishop Andrew reflected on the historic architecture of the building, and spoke about the importance of having a place where the community could come together both in celebration, and in difficult times.

At the same service Reverend Mel was given a new licence and made Priest in Charge of the Parish. Rev'd Mel has, for the past two years, been in the role of Assistant Curate in the Parish. This new licence means that she will be able to remain in Woodend for the foreseeable future.

St Mary's is, once again, open every day of the year for prayer or quiet reflection.





Guided night walks start at 7pm, on:



Hanging Rock's secrets finally revealed

The first comprehensive chronicle of Hanging Rock will shortly be released in a forthcoming book, "Hanging Rock - A History".


Written by noted historian Dr Chris McConville and published by the Friends of Hanging Rock, this unprecedented book provides answers to many long-standing questions about the iconic landmark. Is its geology unique? Who were the traditional custodians? Was Joan Lindsay's story fact or fiction?



The Friends of Hanging Rock committee worked with McConville to draw together information collated over more than three years of research. Sifting through records in historical societies, archives, museums and libraries across the world, members discovered previously unknown material and records, including the earliest known painting of Hanging Rock from 1858, a watercolour by artist W.H.Burkitt.

Friends of Hanging Rock President Luke Spielvogel said, "Hanging Rock has had a profound impact on Australian cultural identity. This is the story of its shared social landscape which we think needed to be told".

"There is a conversation currently that seeks to find








a balance between commercial development and environmental value, Spielvogel added. "This book demonstrates that this friction has long existed here and of course far beyond the Rock. This place remains special for visitors who come for a picnic while also being an icon of global popular culture. Better understanding that diversity of experience remains our great opportunity to ensure Hanging Rock retains its unique place in the Australian imagination."

Legendary Australian broadcaster, writer and filmmaker Phillip Adams, and supporter of the Friends group, has written the book's foreword, and describes it as "a fine book that documents its geological rarity and its cultural significance to indigenous, white and other hued Australians".

The book will be officially launched at the Newham Mechanics Institute in Newham, Victoria at 7.30 pm on Friday 8 December and will be available for sale online and in bookstores. More information can be found at hangingrock.net.au.





'When I'm on the oval and the solar panels are glinting on the Woodend Cricket Club, I love contemplating the clean energy they're generating. Simultaneously, I worry about developing skin cancer!'

Barry plays cricket up to 40 days per year. 'I wear sunscreen, a broad-brimmed hat and sunglasses, but in my youth I used no sun protection and I'll probably pay for that.'

The CFA is about to commence its Fire Ready Victoria Campaign sharing vital messages about the dangers of bushfires and what you should do on a high fire risk day. The aim is to reach residents, especially those in high risk areas (Woodend is in the Top 52) and ensure they have ample information from which to make an informed decision in the event of a bush or grassfire.

The Woodend CFA will be organising a special display at the Woodend Farmer's Market on Saturdays December 2, January 6 and February 3. Members of the Brigade will be there if you need information or have any questions, and we'll also have lots of free brochures and reference material ... as well as free give-aways for the kids. Please drop by and say hi, or you can drop into the Woodend CFA any Sunday morning.

Fire Danger Period - any burn offs will require a Council Permit

The Fire Danger Period will soon came into force. Keep an eye on local newspapers for the official starting date.

Once the restrictions are in place, you will be forbidden to conduct a burn-off in any form, unless you have an official permit from the Macedon Ranges Shire.

If the CFA is called to an illegal burn off during the Fire Danger Period we must call the Police to the scene and serious charges and penalties may be incurred. In fact, lighting a fire in the open without a permit is an offence and can bring a heavy fine or 12 months imprisonment.

Your last chance to burn off!

- All burn-offs should be registered with the VicFire Burn-off notification line on 1800 668 511.
- The Can I or Can't I? brochure, available from the CFA website, features the differences between Fire Restrictions and Total Fire Ban days.
- CFA's On the Land: Agricultural Fire Management Guidelines provides practical fire management advice for people living and working on rural properties. To view and/or download the guidelines, go to www.cfa. vic.gov.au.




